Five Nonprofits have been working together with the Local Government Commission as part of the Community Foundation Water Initiative to equitably integrate water management and land use decision making through their organizations. Leveraging what has been learned through COVID-19 response, the briefing will cover the role that coordinated planning plays in public engagement efforts.

The need for coordination of meaningful public engagement is more important than ever. This is especially true where water and land use decisions are concerned amidst racial injustice and concerns over public health, access to natural resources, economic resilience, and much more.

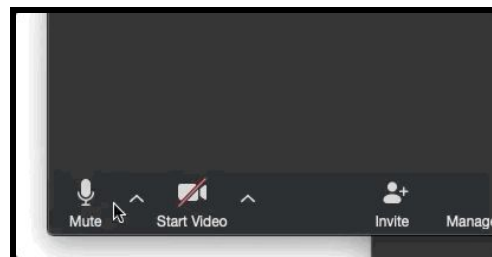

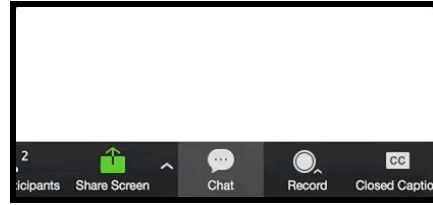
To mute yourself:

In the lower left corner of the zoom screen, click the microphone icon



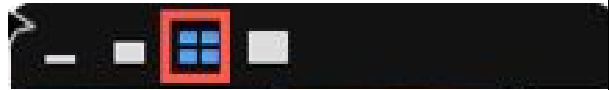
To use the chat box:

If you have a question/comment at any point in the day, you can use the chat box function at the bottom of the screen and communicate with individuals or the group.



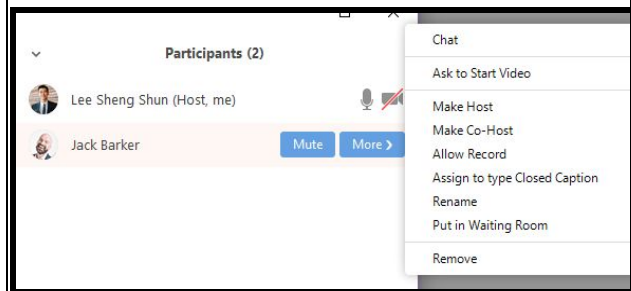
To see multiple speakers:

Use gallery view by selecting the 4x4 grid icon, at the top of the panel.



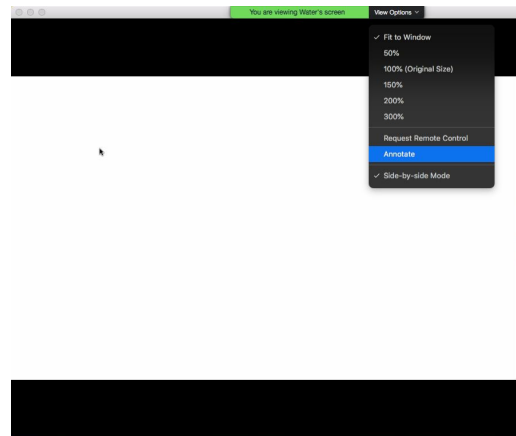
To rename yourself:
