GGRF: Where the Money Goes

Funded First (~\$283 million):

- SRA fee backfill (~\$80m)
- CAEATFA General Fund backfill (\$200 million)
- Legislative Counsel Climate Bureau (\$3 million)

Funded Second (\$2 billion):

- High-Speed Rail (\$1 billion)
- Annual legislative appropriations (\$1 billion)

Funded Third (up to \$1.98 billion)

- Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities (up to \$800 m)
- Transit and Intercity Rail Capital (up to \$400 m)
- Community air protection programs (up to \$250 m)
- Low Carbon Transit Operations (up to \$200 m)
- CAL FIRE (up to \$200 m)
- SAFER drinking water (up to \$130 m)

Insufficient auction revenue

• Proportional reduction of third category.

Excess revenue

• Appropriated by Legislature

GGRF: What the Money Does

Affordable Housing and Sustainable Funding

• Affordable housing, housing-related infrastructure, and transit-oriented projects

Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program

• Projects that reduce GHG by creating or expanding transit systems or ridership

Low Carbon Transit Operations Program

•New or expanded bus or rail, ZE buses, etc.

Forest health and resilience (CAL FIRE)

- •82.5% fire prevention
- •17.5% fuel reduction

Community air monitoring and protection programs

SAFER drinking water program

•Provides drinking water directly and through well and water system improvements

Annual legislative appropriations (\$1 billion)

- •Intent for \$250m in 2026-27:
- •Transit passes, rebuild Topanga Canyon, seed UC Climate Research Center, implement scoping plan
- •2025-26 budget passed in summer designated:
- •Up to \$1.25 billion to backfill CAL FIRE costs in 2026-27
- •Up to \$500 million in 2027-28 and 2028-29 if the state budget is projected to be in deficit

GGRF: What Changed

- Funds for continuously appropriated programs capped and at risk.
- These mostly local programs are only fully funded if auction revenues reach about \$4.25 billion.
- All downside risk of revenue shortfalls are borne by these programs.

- Annual legislative appropriations prioritized
 - Previously received remainder of revenues
 - Now guaranteed \$1 billion per year
 - Also gets excess above about \$4.25 billion
- High-Speed Rail guaranteed \$1 billion
 - Previously received 25% of revenues
- Legislative Counsel Climate Bureau created
- Community air monitoring and protection programs officially added to continuous appropriations.
